### From your Parish Priest

By the time you read this, we shall have opened our churches for individual private prayer, which is good news, and is a step along the way to being able to worship together in church once more.

We still need to follow government guidelines to minimise any risk of spreading the coronavirus. To that end, those visiting any of our churches need to clean their hands both on entry and exit with the hand-gel provided, and to continue to observe the current social distancing rules while in church. Visitors should not share a pew with anyone else, other than members of their household or bubble, and we ask them not to enter those areas of each church that have been marked with barrier tape as 'no entry'.

Because we are in a comparatively sparsely populated area, the risk of cross-infection is deemed to be low, provided visitors comply with these hand-cleaning and distancing guidelines. However, to help minimise risk further, at the end of any period when a church is open it will then be secured and left effectively in quarantine for 72 hours before re-opening. This follows the scientific advice that the risk of onward infection has become negligible after this time, and avoids the need to deep-clean the church after every open period.

Thus, our weekly church opening timetable is currently as follows:

Well, a new one for us, we 'Zoomed' on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> May when we held the Annual Parish Council meeting during which time we formally voted Caro How as chair and Nicholas Fowle as vice chair. Understandably, no representatives from either county or district or members of the community joined us. Minutes of the previous meeting were passed and it was noted that certain matters raised were still in abeyance due to the current situation. The councillors were given updates regarding Covid-19. Concern was expressed about the early cutting by the NCC highways contractor of the verges including the damage done to bluebells. This has been raised with NCC. A number of other highways issues were discussed and it was noted that a representative is to visit the area in the near future. Permission was given to purchase new hoses for the staithe. Unfortunately the replacement taps have yet to be delivered due to a supply issue, but once received, the taps and the new hoses will be immediately fitted. The current financial situation was noted and payments approved. Due to the time limit of the meeting it was closed promptly after 40 minutes. You will then be asked to provide your bank details to pay for the test (£50). **THIS IS A SCAM.**

### **Neatishead, Irstead & Barton Turf Community Heritage Group**

Sadly, at the time of writing this, we have no idea when we might be able to get together again as a group to bring you talks and displays, but hope it will be not too long away and we hope you are all keeping safe and well. Our group was formed in 2013 in order to commemorate World War One and was successful in obtaining a Heritage Lottery Grant for our project 'Living through World War One in Neatishead, Irstead and Barton Turf'. As part of this project from 2014-2018 we spent a considerable amount of time studying the 1911 census and this formed the foundation of our research to establish which men from the villages served during The Great War. This culminated in the memorial plaque in the New Victory Hall, to 136 men from our villages who served. Some further research at this time looked at the populations and households during 1911 and compared this with available information for 2011, one hundred years later. More details of this research, is available on our World War One website [www.greatwar.nibchg.org.uk](http://www.greatwar.nibchg.org.uk) but came to the following conclusions: Neatishead - the number of households had nearly doubled over the 100 years but the population had only increased by 10%; Barton Turf - the number of households had more than doubled over the 100 years but the population increased by only 25%; Irstead - the number of households has nearly doubled over the 100 years but the population had decreased by 33%. Many differing factors have affected these changes over the years but one major factor was the decrease in the number of children and young people under the age of 18 years in the villages.

Our research into World War Two continues and it will be interesting to look at populations and households in the villages at this time - I suspect it will be the years following when most changes came. Related to this, and another area of research we initiated a year or two ago was a buildings survey, asking residents to help us collate information about their houses in order to create an archive of buildings for the villages - some being built over 100 years ago and others within the last 10 years. We would like to continue to gather information which is not to be simply restricted to properties of great age, but to all buildings, as those built in the last 20 years, will be 'old' in 100 years' time. As we are interested in 'historic' buildings, generations to come will be interested to learn about how our villages appear today. We hope you will be willing to help with as little or as much information as you are happy to give us - such as when the property was built, who built it or caused it to be built, names of previous owners or tenants. ## **Wildlife Notes**

I ended my notes in May by mentioning the RSPB swift nesting project and since then have been contacted by some local residents who are interested in encouraging the swifts to continue nesting in our villages. If anyone is interested in supporting this project or who has a property which already has nesting swifts and would like to erect swift nest boxes please get in contact.

My five remaining blue tit chicks flew the nest box early in the morning on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> May and I was just in time to photograph one of them as it sat on the ground by my greenhouse looking very vulnerable. Fortunately, the adult birds were keeping an eye on it and bringing it food but I was relieved when it climbed up the rambler rose and gained enough height to enable it to fly across to the oak tree where its brothers and sisters were gathered. The night before, when I checked the camera, I had noted that the adult bird was not in the nest box with the chicks, behaviour which I had also noticed last year just before the chicks fledged. Perhaps the adult bird just couldn't stand being with a load of teenagers any longer!

I have enjoyed my lockdown walks to Alderfen this spring and been pleased to see at least three broods of coot, one with five chicks, and as I write this the great crested grebes have three chicks although the mute swans seemed to have failed. I have had several sightings of hobbies feeding on dragonflies and of swallowtail butterflies and norfolk hawkers but the bird of interest there for me was a grasshopper warbler. It is quite difficult to see but has a distinctive 'reeling' sound described as being like a fishing reel being wound in or like a grasshopper buzzing. I am indebted to the local resident who sent me some excellent photos of it. During May the UK has seen a sudden influx from Europe of a foreign type of starling known as the rosy starling with over 50 individual birds seen across the country. These birds are the same size as our starlings but the adults have bright pink on the chest and back and really stand out when they mix with the local starlings. There have been some in Norfolk so look out for them.

## Health Matters, June 2020 – Hoveton and Wroxham Medical Centre

The priorities of the GP partners and staff during the Covid-19 pandemic are:

1. Maintaining our primary care services – including dispensing medicines.
2. Minimising the risk of infection within the Medical Centre to enable us to maintain our services and to protect patients and staff.
3. Contingency planning to make sure we are prepared.

- **Appointments:** The Medical Centre has now settled in to a new routine that enables our priorities to be met. Most appointments continue to be by telephone unless the clinical decision is that a face-to-face appointment is necessary.  
Please do not come to the Medical Centre if you do not have an appointment.  
We would encourage patients to wear face coverings/masks when they attend the surgery.
- **Self-Referral Physiotherapy:** Hoveton and Wroxham Medical Centre is now offering an additional NHS service for patients who have spinal, joint or soft tissue pain. The service provides a telephone call from a specialist physiotherapist with diagnosis, advice regarding treatment and, if necessary, referral on to specialist services. Face-to-face services will be implemented when the current CovidD-19 situation allows.  
For self-referral, please call Pure Physiotherapy on 01603 791190.
- **Hospital Referrals:** Patients should still expect to wait longer than usual for non-urgent or elective procedures during these unprecedented times. Each hospital will be contacting their patients as appointments/operations are confirmed. Or alternatively, please contact Outpatient bookings via the NNUH switchboard on 01603 286286.
- **Routine Health Checks:** After a temporary reduction in numbers of health checks and annual reviews, we are now increasing capacity within the infection control rules. Prioritisation will be based on clinical assessment and patients will be sent reminders in the normal way.
- **Most Vulnerable Patients:** Every one of us is vulnerable during this terrible pandemic. However, some are more vulnerable than others. The NHS initiated work in late March to highlight and warn those most vulnerable patients. A letter was then sent by the NHS advising patients to 'shield', meaning a strict regime of precautions in addition to the lockdown precautions we are all following. We are expecting the Government to write to shielding patients before the end of June. Further advice can be found through our website.
- **Testing:** We can offer testing for research purposes on the rare occasions that patients are symptomatic within the Practice but prompt testing is administered externally through the NHS website or by phoning 119.
- **Communication:** Our website and email are the main ways of communicating with patients. So far this has proved successful allowing demand and clinical capacity to be better managed. Those with no internet access can continue to telephone as usual.
- **Bottom Line:** The statistics show, but one should always be wary of statistics, that we have very few cases amongst our patient population; fewer than 10 confirmed cases. This will not include those infected but untested. Rigorous measures within our care homes have also been extremely successful. The practice nevertheless continues to do everything it can to minimise the risk within the building.
